Chica Bonita: a Spanish phrase – “pretty girl.”

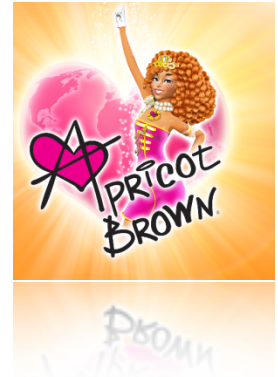
Ciao (sounds like “chow”): an Italian word used in parting – “Goodbye.”
